Since our last newsletter report we have had success in our funding application to the Chinese Poll Tax Heritage Trust. This will help fund the upgrade of our entrance and ablutions area in the WCA Centre. This is planned for later this year. Coming up are some exciting events that we hope our members and families will embrace.

3 March we are planning a combined Chinese New Year dinner and launch for the "Fruits of our Labours" history book on NZ Chinese fruit shops. This includes details of all the families involved in the fruit shop and vegetable business all around NZ and also in the Waikato region. This event is open to members and non-members.

17th March is our special picnic day outing for our members where they can enjoy an easy walk, a quiet picnic with friends by the river or some bike riding on the famous Waikato River trails. Easter will see a small but keen contingent attending & representing Waikato at the NZCA Easter Sports and Cultural Tournament being held in Wellington this year.

6-8 April is a special weekend trip being undertaken to the Far North of New Zealand to be a part of the historical unveiling of the SS Ventnor memorial. This is a significant event for NZCA, where we are acknowledging the local Maori Iwi for looking after our passed people and to give recognition and remembrance to the early Chinese that helped pave the way for the future generations of Chinese in NZ. Please feel free to join us if you are at all interested as we would welcome all members to attend.

Past events have included our Mid-Autumn festival dinner in September last, where we had moon cake making again. This was particularly well received from participants and a popular event. Amongst our guests was local party MP's and General Election candidates who were given an opportunity to speak. It was interesting to note that past local National MP Tim Macindoe was complimentary about his relationship with our branch and made mention of his long-standing relationship with our patron Mr Donald Kwok who is now over 90 years of age and still attending branch events. Our Association values the support from all our local MPs.



Many of us remember well the daily or weekly trip to the local shops to buy our food supplies – Meat, bread, milk, fruit and veges. Often, the fruit and vege shop was run by a Chinese family, all working together to provide the customer with the freshest fruit and produce, always accompanied by personalised service. However, the introduction of self-service retailing and the emergence of supermarkets led to the demise of the independent retailer, and the days of the Chinese fruiterer have all but ended.

The Fruits of Our Labours traces the development of Chinese fruit shops from the general store-cum-greengrocer of the 1880s through to the fresh fruit and vegetable retailer of today. The 1950s and 60s were the heyday years of Chinese fruit shops: a time of economic growth and prosperity after the hard times of the Depression and the Second World War, both of which affected Chinese fruiterers.

Authors Ruth Lam, Beverly Lowe, Helen Wong, Michael Wong, and Carolyn King were commissioned by the Chinese Poll Tax Heritage Trust to produce this fully-illustrated, two-volume set. It combines historical research and statistics with the personal stories and photographs of Chinese fruit shop families to give a better understanding of the hard work and sacrifice that led to their eventual prosperity and that of their descendants – the fruits of their labours.

The above photo taken at the 75th anniversary celebration in 2014 is of some of the refugee children who arrived in New Zealand from 1939 -1941. Some accompanied their mothers, some came as students to rejoin other family members already here and others who were in China during the Sino-Japanese war and were returning to New Zealand.

The CPTHT (Chinese Poll Tax Heritage Trust) has recently commissioned Meilin Chong and Lily Lee to produce a book regarding the History of Chinese Refugee Mothers and Children from 1939 – 1947. But first we would like to produce a comprehensive data base of the 249 mothers and 244 children who came during those years. We would also like the names of the children born in New Zealand between 1939 and July 1947 to refugee mothers.
