PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- · Waikato Chinese Association's 80th Anniversary was celebrated at the Mid-Autumn Festival event in September 2018. Congratulations to Isabel Lim and Ken Parker who were awarded Life Membership in recognition for their long service to our Association.
- Our annual Waikato Big Fish Tournament Challenge was held at the end of last year and once again the Auckland team narrowly won by just a few extra fish.
- Our annual End of Year Xmas Dinner with the Secret Santa There was good numbers in attendance December 2018.
- CNY was celebrated with a dinner for members at the hall in February 2019 It was good to see attendance by members, friends and their families. Activities included Wonton making, Mah Jong instruction and were held in the afternoon, followed by the usual sumptuous Chinese meal and then some extra fun afterwards, with the "no cost to enter" spot prize raffles. This was the highlight of the evening. Some new Engineering Chinese graduates from local Wintec attended and we were pleased to welcome them as new members as a result.
- Our VP, Fee Ching Tan attended a Hamilton City Council Ethnic meeting as WCA representative in early February also as part of a Council initiative to develop ideas for more inclusive programs to welcome new migrants to the city.
- The branch organised a visit for interested members to Tauranga for a day in early March Highlights included yum char lunch and Chinese evening banquet at the local restaurants with additional visits to the local hot mineral pools and a good walk to the top of Mt Maunganui.
- · Our Women's group still meets monthly and new members are always welcome. Attendance continues to grow.
- · Report from first NZCA Executive meeting this year suggests that the S S Ventnor project is still in "limbo" and despite a new site being found, the costs are expected to increase. Awaiting a new proposal report before a decision is finalised.
- Executive Committee members Johnathan Tan and May Low attended the memorial unveiling at a Hamilton Council ceremony for past councillor Phillip Yeung.
- Easter Tournament this year was held in Dunedin. No Waikato teams participated and only a small contingent went from Auckland. Teams from Dunedin Christchurch and Wellington made up the majority. Wellington won the tournament and also received the Friendship trophy.
- Report from Chinese Poll Tax Trust this year suggests fewer funding grants to be distributed for first half of 2019 due to lower number of applicants. The Trust continues to encourage people to apply for the relevant grants that pertain to projects related to all Poll Tax descendants.

- · We sadly bid farewell to Mr Ian Howat, our long and valued member, who passed away earlier this month after a battle with illness. He was awarded a special "Appreciation of Services" award and I was honoured to speak on behalf of the branch at his service.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP AWARDED TO LONG SERVING AUDITOR- KEN PARKER

At the tender age of 22 years in February 1967, Ken commenced employment at A B Donald (Hamilton) Ltd, a Fruit & Produce market. Over the following 27 years he made the acquaintance of numerous Chinese retailers and growers. Amongst those he grew to know best were a grower and previous Treasurer of the Association Young 'Youngie' Toy; another Treasurer Guy Young and also four other retailers – Sid Lim, Mick Joe, George 'Sugar' Joe and Keith Joe. A B Donald (Hamilton) Ltd became part of the Turners & Growers Group in 1973, In 1994, when Ken was a Company Secretary of Turners Waikato Markets Ltd, management issues beyond his control meant he was made redundant.

Unemployment for several months, . but still keen, he was approached by the Association President Mick Joe in Barton Street, who said they were looking for a competent Auditor – and of course hinted to Ken, if he would be interested. He says he was delighted to be asked especially by a group of people he greatly admired (and continues to do so to this day). Ken began the audit work immediately. This was confirmed with a visit to his home within days from the then Treasurer



So 1994 was Ken's first of 25 years, working with a succession of great servants of the Association – Guy, as I've mentioned, Shu-yin Wong; Way Lee; Con Tan and finally Kewwa Low.
