

Note from the Editor...

History, a chronological study of events with a common connection. Our collective history as Chinese New Zealanders is an important story to be told and unites us all. There are many leaders in our community, many of whom are and have been active in the NZCA Auckland branch who have laid the foundations for telling the stories of our collective past. As an organisation, we aim to continue to promote and take ownership of the narrative of our history.

There is much going on in the wider community to extend the accessibility of our collective history. In particular, I draw attention to the upcoming events featured in our newsletter - the 85th anniversary celebration of the first Chinese war refugees arriving in New Zealand. This group of 239 women and 244 children arrived in New Zealand to seek refuge from the Japanese invasion of Canton with the first refugees arriving 85 years ago. Speaking about this event and its history to our NZCA Auckland Branch Chairperson Richard Leung, I learned that it is commonly not well understood/recognised that this group of refugees are in fact the first official group of refugees to arrive in New Zealand and we aim to continue to correct this narrative. You will find details of this special celebration in our newsletter. I recently took the liberty to read some of the stories featured in the book Farewell

Guangdong which documents the chapter in our history that is to be celebrated at the event. Farewell Guangdong is but one of a growing collection of books commissioned by the Chinese Poll Tax Heritage Trust (CPTHT). I feel a great sense of pride for the community when I hear stories from students who recognize this book as sitting on the shelves of their school library or hearing that a secondary school history teacher owns a copy of the book.

As a community, we look forward to the launch of the latest addition to the published works telling the significant stories of our past. Golden Enterprise is the latest book commissioned by the CPTHT, it gives a detailed account of the Cantonese Merchants of New Zealand and will be launched officially at an event, the details of this event will be emailed out at a later date.

At a recent national NZCA conference held in Wellington, a group of our committee members had the opportunity to get an update on the work done to bring the New Zealand Chinese History Curriculum and website to life. Kirsten Wong is leading this work with the support of NZCA Auckland branch member Jef Wong and his company Designworks. We had a sneak peak into the design process Jef and his associate Liam Ooi used to deliver a creative platform that our NZ Chinese history curriculum will be presented. I think it's fair to say the room was left speechless with what we saw, we look forward to the day where we as an organisation can share the final work with you. Our gratitude goes to Jef Wong and his company Designworks for their generous and significant contribution to our community.

Our committee looks forward to seeing many of you at our upcoming events. Book Launch, August Moon Festival Dinner, NZCA Night Out (Rugby, Music, Drinks & Catch Ups) and 85th Anniversary celebration of the first Chinese War refugees arrival just to name a few. Till then, go well.

Kirsten Wong is a third-generation New Zealander and community heritage advocate. She has worked on the Government's 2002 poll-tax apology, the SS Ventnor memorial in the Hokianga and is now working for the New Zealand Chinese Association on a Chinese New Zealand history website. She recently spoke at a joint symposium in Beijing hosted by the New Zealand Contemporary China Research Centre and the China Academy of Social Sciences.

One of the benefits of being part of this network we call the NZ Chinese Association is the connections we make with members from other branches. Kirsten Wong is one of those connections our NZCA Auckland Branch committee have had the privilege of meeting at national conferences and working with on projects of significance to our NZ Chinese community.

Tickets are selling out quickly and are limited so please do not delay.


















A note about unsubscribing
