History and profile:

Mr Quoon Chin migrated to New Zealand at eleven years old with his Grandfather in 1948.

He studied at Christchurch East School and com-



pleted his education with a building certificate at the Christchurch Technical Institute. Qualifying as the first Chinese builder in Christchurch.

Married to Jennifer who also contributes endlessly to volunteer work, raised five well-rounded and talented children with exceptional careers. Three Doctors, one Architect and one Builder following his Dad's footsteps. With his generous time and dedication to services towards NZCA Canterbury for over 22 years as the Hall Custodian. He has maintained and repaired the Chinese Association Hall saving our community a considerable amount of money over the many years.

He is the Principal and has managed the NZCA Canterbury Chinese Language School for over 15 years every Sunday. His passion to provide a school in order to preserve the Cantonese and Mandarin language, to ensure the mother language is not lost among the New Zealand Chinese children.

Coordinator and organizes the Chinese festival lunch celebrations such as the Chinese Lunar New Year, Jung Festival and Mid-Autumn (Mooncake) Festivals, catering for over 200 people at our functions.


An Executive Committee member for over 20 years who contributes his expertise and experience by providing input and gives guidance towards our meetings to assist in maintaining a strong organisation.
